

SEEING THINGS DIFFERENTLY DUMBARTON ROCK DESIGN CHARRETTE

25 to 26 FEBRUARY 2015 at DUMBARTON FOOTBALL CLUB 27 to 28 FEBRUARY 2015 at THE NEW BURGH HALL

West Dunbartonshire Council with the support of the Scottish Government and Historic Scotland, is holding a design charrette in Dumbarton between 25 and 28 February 2015. A charrette is an intensive public consultation that engages local people in the design of their community. The Scottish Government has selected the Dumbarton Rock and Castle area along with other towns, including Clydebank, to support locally driven design charrettes. This event provides the opportunity for anybody interested in the area to get involved in helping to promote the Rock and Castle as an important heritage destination and to plan for its future. The charrette's main aims are to:

- Develop a **shared long-term vision** for Dumbarton Rock and Castle and its immediate setting;
- Identify how Dumbarton can benefit from the development of the Rock and Castle as a major visitor attraction and from the redevelopment of sites near the Rock;
- Establish how Dumbarton's tourism, cultural and heritage assets can be exploited and to ensure that all new development contributes to making Dumbarton an attractive place to visit and to live in; and
- Establish a clear masterplan and action plan for turning the results of the charrette into a longer term strategy.

A project team led by Anderson Bell Christie Architects is assisting the Council with the charrette. All interested parties including the general public, local residents and businesses, are welcome to attend. You can choose the event that suits you best from the programme below. All events and groups will be facilitated by members of the project team to help draw up ideas and plans. Refreshments will be available throughout each day for participants and a sandwich lunch provided on Wednesday and Thursday. A follow up event will take place on in March 2015 to outline the proposed masterplan and action plan. Further details will be supplied nearer the time.
