## What we did

### **OUR COURSES**

This year felt like a full return to community classes after the pandemic.

We increased the number of learners attending and the amount of classes:

- 42 certificated classes with West College Scotland
- 7 ongoing Adult Literacy and Numeracy Groups
- 4 ongoing ESOL groups and a summer programme
- 19 Family Learning projects
- 9 'First Steps' courses
- 5 ongoing Digital Friends
   Groups and 1 Digital Skills
   programme for people with

As ever, our programme is supported by dedicated volunteers. 26 volunteers helped out in groups this year. We revamped our volunteer training course and delivered 7 staff development sessions on a range of subjects for volunteers, paid staff and partners

### LEARNER VOICE

The Learner Voice Group (WDLV) had a busy year providing a voice for learners and raising awareness of the benefits of adult education.

They were successful in getting funding to run a Festival of Learning. 150 learners took part in a very enjoyable day
